

All Colleges Online Course Satisfaction Survey Report Fall 2012

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## **Overview and Purpose**

The purpose of this survey project is to collect additional information about students who took online courses in the Fall 2012 semester. This report was created to measure students' perceptions and opinions about elements involved in online courses such as preparation, experiences in the course, technical support, classroom support and communication, and students' perception of learning.

## Methodology

### **Survey Population**

To be eligible for the study, a student had to be enrolled in an online course at City College, Mesa College, Miramar College, or ECC in the fall semester prior to the start of data collection in November 2012. Students who dropped or never attended the course were excluded. Cancelled courses, open entry/exit courses, chemistry labs, and biology labs were also excluded.

### Implementation

A pre-notification email was sent to students by the Office of Institutional Research and Planning prior to data collection informing them about the forthcoming online student satisfaction survey. Students subsequently received an emailed survey invitation with a link to the online survey in November 2012. In an effort to increase survey response rates, three reminder emails with direct access to the survey were sent to the survey population during the three week data collection. Online and Distributed Learning posted notifications to Blackboard to inform students about email invitations to the survey.

### Instrumentation and Analytical Plan

The Office of Institutional Research and Planning referenced the previous 2011 Online Course Satisfaction survey and collaborated with the Dean of Online and Distributed Learning to develop and confirm the 2012 survey questions. The survey instrument contained 28 questions and took approximately five minutes for students to complete. A copy of the survey is provided in Appendix A.

Students were permitted to complete one survey for each college they were enrolled in. Therefore, while survey data for each college are unduplicated, data for all colleges may include duplicated records of individual students. Thus, the unit of analysis for the All College survey results (excluding student demographics) is the survey response itself and not the individual respondent.

Analyses of demographic questions in the Student Profile include two comparison groups: the survey respondents and the general online student population. To accurately represent the demographics of the populations, All College survey and general population demographic results are unduplicated. Note that individual response categories may not total 100% due to rounding.

Results from this survey are clustered into five general areas:

- (1) Student Preparation for Online Course
- (2) Student Experience in Online Course
- (3) Technical Support
- (4) Classroom Support and Communication
- (5) Perception of Online Learning and Future Services

Verbatim responses are listed in Appendix B and are edited with \*\*\* only in the case of derogatory language or to protect an individual's identity. Notable trends in student satisfaction from previous SDCCD Online Course Satisfaction Survey reports (2010 and 2011) are also provided in the Highlight of Findings.

### **Student Profile**

In Fall 2012, the General Online Population headcounts at City College/ECC (4,274), Mesa College (5,113), and Miramar College (3,515) totaled 12,902 potential respondents. Approximately one percent of the students supplied a shared email address, an invalid email address, or no email address and were excluded. Approximately two percent of the students had previously opted out of receiving future surveys and were also excluded. Of the 12,565 surveys that were sent to students, 1,819 surveys were returned, yielding a 14% response rate. The response rate does not provide statistical representativeness of the population of online students served within the San Diego Community College District. However, it is higher than the previous two years (12% in 2011 and 12% in 2010). The following is a profile of All College students (students are unduplicated; survey respondents n=1,672 and general online population N=10,715).

- Mesa College students comprised 39% of all students who completed surveys, City College/ECC students comprised 35%, and Miramar students comprised 26% of all students who completed surveys (see Table 1).
- The majority of students who responded reported their course(s) as fully online (77%; see Table 2).
- Over half of the respondents were below the age of 30 (57%) and about twothirds of respondents were female (67%; see Tables 3 and 4).
- Forty-one percent of the respondents reported their ethnicity as White, 21% were Latino, 14% were Asian/Pacific Islander, 9% were African American, 5% were Filipino, and 1% were American Indian/Alaskan Native (see Table 5).

Survey respondents were similar to the general online population in college distribution. However, respondents varied in gender, age, and ethnicity compared to the general online population. Therefore, satisfaction is only generalizable to those students who participated in the survey.

## Highlight of the Findings

### **Student Preparation for Online Course**

- The majority of students who responded to the 2012 survey had some college-level experience with online courses during the past two years: 66% had taken a course at SDCCD and 23% had taken a course at another college (see Tables 6 and 7). While the percentage of respondents who had recently taken a course at another college remained steady between 2010 and 2012 (23% in each year), the percentage of students who had recently taken an online course at SDCCD decreased from 70% to 66%.
- Most 2012 respondents (74%) felt they had sufficient information about online course requirements prior to enrolling (see Table 8). However, fewer than two-thirds of those who rated the Online Learning Readiness Assessment and Blackboard orientation in 2012, felt they were helpful (60% and 62%, respectively; see Tables 9-10), and satisfaction with the assessment and the orientation decreased from 2010 (68% and 67%, respectively).

### **Student Experience in Online Course**

- Over three-quarters of the respondents (77%) enrolled in one or two online courses during Fall 2012 (see Table 11). Most of the respondents (95%) visited their online course(s) at least a few times a week, and close to two-thirds of the students (62%) spent four or more hours logged into their online course per week (see Tables 12-13).
- When asked the reason why they took their online course, students who responded in 2012 most often reported an intention to transfer to a four-year university (36%) or a desire to apply the course toward their AA/AS degree (32%; see Table 14).
- The most popular reasons offered as the cause of students' online course withdrawal in 2012 were: personal reasons (21%), that the course was too time consuming (21%), that the course was too difficult (21%), and that the course did not fit into their personal or work schedule (20%; see Table 15). Between 2010 and 2012, withdrawal due to course difficulty increased from 16% to 21%, and withdrawal due to a preference for in-person classes increased from 12% to 17%.

### **Technical Support**

- Over three-quarters of the respondents in 2012 (77%) agreed that they had a positive experience using the online course tools (see Table 16).
- Approximately half of the students who responded in 2012 (53%) felt they were able to obtain needed help from the 24/7 Blackboard Helpdesk; however, about one-quarter of the students who responded (24%) did not find it helpful and one-quarter were unsure (23%; see Table 17).

### **Classroom Support and Communication**

- Most 2012 respondents (89%) referenced the course syllabus for information about course requirements (see Table 18).
- The majority of the 2012 respondents preferred a response to questions within 12 or 24 hours (22% and 52%, respectively; see Table 19). Among respondents with questions, two out of three (69%) felt that their instructors responded within the timeframe stated in the course syllabus. However, among those students who responded neutrally (10%) or did not feel that their instructors responded in a timely fashion (21%), 64% of the students did not know where to go for help with their questions (see Tables 20 and 21).
- While the majority of the 2012 respondents felt that they could communicate effectively with their classmates and instructors (72% and 74%, respectively; see Tables 22 and 23), overall satisfaction with classmate and instructor communication decreased somewhat from 2010 (77% each). The top method proposed as being effective for communicating with instructors in 2012 was email (80%). Other popular methods of student-teacher communication were announcements and the discussion board (41% each; see Table 24).

### Perception of Online Learning and Future Services

- Most 2012 respondents felt that the online format was an effective way to learn and that the number of students in the course was appropriate (75% and 72%, respectively; see Table 25 and 26).
- The majority of the 2012 respondents (66%) would take another online course rather than a traditional on-campus course if given the choice; however, some respondents felt it would be unlikely that they would take another online course over a traditional on-campus course and some were unsure (18% and 16%, respectively; see Table 27).

- 190. I am taking a Business Communications course where participation is most of the grade. The course has projects for group participation which is hard to acheive because everyone are on different schedules. If I participate and give my comments sometimes group members will not respond in a timely manner for me to receive my participation credit. It is real hard to pass the class and learn anything. This is just my opiniion. It seems to me that in a group participation course it is not fair the student has no control of what her/his participation is credible and left up to the instructor to decided the students fate of pass or fail.
- 191. I beg of you PLEASE, give us either a college Email, or send us announcements for assignments or class news to our emails. the system lacks interaction and not having email support is annoying, it dramatically increases the chances for students to lack commitment. you always forget to check in for assignments because your always busy with other classes and not having reminders is really critical. this is unacceptable.
- 192. I believe a meeting with the instructor before the begining of the course to better clarify questions and some aspects of the course

- 193. I believe that better communication can occur. I was able to activly participate in the class up to 2 weeks after the class was technically withdrawn, and at that point I was unable to reinstate myself.
- 194. I believe with a course you should be able to retake one test in the event f something going wrong with your computer.
- 195. I can't think of any right now
- 196. I did not like the fact that we had absolutely no lecture. I felt like I was completely self taught. It seems a bit unfair that I'm basically just paying someone to grade my homework.
- 197. I did not like the lack of involvement of the professor. I know the professor is most likely busy teaching and possibly working another job, but regardless I feel like its unacceptable to not answer a student's questions for an online course until 1-2 weeks later or even not at all. Discussion boards on articles that the students must talk about every week is positive but I believe the Professor should also make a few discussion board comments as well, so that we the students get a more authoritative input.
- 198. I didn't know how to use Blackboard and it was tough to get accustom too. I was hoping that there would be a lesson in class on the first or second day. I am still learning new things on it and I have been using it now for at least a year.
- 199. I didn't know what to do at first. When I registered, I didn't receive anything. I contacted the teacher and my first chapter was due in a couple days. I must have fallen through the cracks. Was not told to sign in to Blackboard until after I reached out to instructor
- 200. I didn't like that teacher kept changing deadlines of assignments. And deadlines were always weekdays at 5pm. If you work full time like I do, that meant I had less time to turn things in because I would have to turn it in the night before
- 201. I dislike when the focus of the course is a textbook, including exercises/coursework. I prefer more conceptional and creative methods, which the hybrid classes permitted and were more flexible.
- 202. I do not believe this professor is capable of orchestrating a college level course, and am highly unsatisfied with my experience.
- 203. I do not think that I would change anything about this course.
- 204. I don not have any change.
- 205. I don't believe I would change anything about the course, one thing I would say is make sure you can access your work on the computer, I have a window vista and had micro soft office stored, I had a lot of problems with it, I found it difficult to access most of my syllabus from blackboard and also I was not able to access my midterm on line, 3 hour limit and 1.5 hours had passed before I could complete my midterm, so I had approximately 1.5 hour to complete.
- 206. I don't know
- 207. I don't know.
- 208. I don't like assignments being due on Friday, it be better if they were due on Sunday.
- 209. I dont like it how the program times me out and I have to sign back in if I spend too much time on homework or something.
- 210. I enjoy having a discussion with fellow students but grading class participation in an online class is ridiculous to me. The intention of the discussion board is for students to interact with each other but the end result is just busywork of making a post every week. I would prefer to just learn the material and do the assignments rather than be forced to try and have online interactions on a message board which has never enriched my learning experience.
- 211. I enjoyed it thoroughly. The instructor was in touch with us and very clear on expectations and requirements. Nothing!
- 212. I enjoyed the course. No changes necessary.
- 213. I feel like the lessons in the book were no congruent with the quizzes, tests and discussions required in the course. I would like more instruction directly dedicated to questions that will be on quizzes.
- 214. I feel that how many hours you log into the actual blackboard site should not be enough to drop you from a course if all of your course work is done outside of blackboard or teachers should create the assignments in blackboard. If I'm on the book site for 4 hours reading the book and

doing the assignment, it shouldn't matter that it only took me 20 minutes to upload the work I feel that some teachers become too concerned with the blackboard time although they assign things from other sites as well.

- 215. I feel that the greatest point of on-line classes is to allow people to complete all assignments when convenient for them and self pacing. One of my classes had very strict deadlines for when each assignment and test was due which I felt only took away from the greatest advantage of an online course. I think all online courses should have very flexible due dates for assignments up until the final deadline for assignments. I understand that having to grade a large number of assignments at once can be overwhelming but many inline courses especially the one I took have mostly multiple choice questions and other assignments that are completely automatically graded by the system and the instructor didn't really do much of anything. In this case, I think it is appropriate to not insist on assignment deadlines, especially in an online course. I highly value having complete flexibility on when to complete assignments. Due to my schedule, I may not have a chance to complete full assignments for 2 weeks, and then be able to catch up in the next weeks no problem and having strict deadlines prevents me from being able to do this.
- 216. I felt that the teacher in this course had very involved material but then she would quiz us on things that she thought we just have assumed knowledge on. So even if I did all of the work, I would go to take the quiz and still only receive an average grade because she didn't ask questions directly from the work we were given. Or she would have us do an online activity that wasn't something you could save and would then ask you about specific numbers over two weeks later when you couldn't access the information and were never instructed to keep notes on that activity. I felt that she taught the course as though you were going to be a geology major and for a course that was only supposed to be an overview of different Earth Sciences, I felt it was too intense, which made it difficult to enjoy the course.
- 217. I felt the course was very effective as it was.
- 218. i had no problems with this class. I learned alot and it has helped me in my job career.
- 219. I hate teachers who give a ""self-paced course"" where they just give you a total of 5+ exams to be completed at any time during the course. I don't feel students benefit or learn from this type of online course. We need discussion, homework, etc to make sure we fully understand the material. I have take at least 20 online classes at SDCCD and I love the format, but I can't stand lazy teachers who think it's okay to just give exams with know other way to warn points to improve your grade. I don't think it should be allowed what-so-ever!
- 220. I have no complaints
- 221. I have no idea
- 222. I have three courses right now. One of them has poor instructor feedback. The other two are terrific in this same exact light. For the one poor on feedback, I would give him [the instructor] a heart.
- 223. I haven't encountered anything that requires changing for this particular course.
- 224. I highly recommend McGraw-Hill as a tool in teaching courses because they help the student learn much more.
- 225. I hope the teacher would have responded in a timely manner to our questions.
- 226. I know it's difficult to grade many assignments with with 300 students but waiting for assignments to be graded for weeks at a time was pretty annoying
- 227. I learn well as a listener, so if the lectures could be recorded I could key in on the instructor and understand what they were trying to emphasize and so forth. With it being an online course, an instructor could record the lecture given in an on campus course (same class) and post it as a podcast. That would be VERY helpful.
- 228. Î like it the way it is.
- 229. I like just the way it is.
- 230. I like the instructors to use the calendar as much as possible for due dates
- 231. I need immediate help.
- 232. I need more detail lectures for each chapter by visual media. Also each test the instructor need to give out the review.

- 233. I read at the beginning of the course that I had to attend one face to face tutoring session to get online tutoring. Unfortunately I am working in Northern California and didn't have the time to take off. That was somewhat disappointing and not having the option of tutoring made the class much more time consuming and difficult.
- 234. I really enjoyed the book we used and found it informative- I would not change anything.
- 235. I really enjoyed this class. I wouldn't change anything.
- 236. I suggest that the instructors (even though it's fully online course) they should keep in touch with students by simple commenting on the graded homework. Just a little thing to communicate every assignments
- 237. I tend to forget when assignments are due, it would be nice if blackboard would send us notifications the day things are due to remind us.
- 238. I think \*\*\* has a great outline for the course and presents great learning materials and assignments.
- 239. I think extra credt should be offered like in person classes
- 240. I think it was great!!!! Instructor was helpful:)
- 241. I think it would be a good idea to send a copy of announcements to students emails because during this course I did not alway log on everyday and when I did it did not always log on after the instructor posted something on the announcements board
- 242. I think it would be helpful if there was a way to set up reminders 24 hrs before something is due. It was the first time I had taken online courses and it was really hard to remember and sched my time around 2 online courses
- 243. I think many of the people taking online courses is because they have to. Maybe they have kids, or a job, etc. Sometimes it was kind of hard for me to meet certain deadlines and the period for turning in an assignment would pass and I'd loose my chance. If deadlines could remain open, and just some points be taken out for being late, or something along those lines, I believe it would be beneficial.
- 244. I think more math examples and formulas in the course content might have been helpful.
- 245. I think most couses woul benefit by being supremely organized, with lots of information. Online classed suffer from lack of communication. Maybe add online teacher lectures or videos to facilitate more communication.
- 246. I think that I would not change anything, it was perfect.
- 247. I think that more students could be enrolled in online classes because many online students stop attending during the semester, leaving sometimes very few students in the class (one time only 10). Students should be warned much more about the commitment of online classes so that space in these classes isn't going to waste on non-participating students who thought it was going to be an easy class.
- 248. I think those doing Child dev. need to do this class ""The exceptional Child
- 249. I think we should have more online course
- 250. I understand the course is of history enrichment, but I would change the amount of reading assignments per week since the readings assigned were too many considering students do have other classes and reading 100 or more pages per week added to any other class it very overwhelming. Another change could be adding the option to skip a question(s) on the online tests and be able to go back and answer such question(s) before submitting the tests.
- 251. I was expecting that it's more class even though its online, however, no explanation on the chapters, all I do is just read the textbook and take exams every week. This is first time taking online course at this district so I don't know all the classes are the same or not.
- 252. I was forced to use and pay for MyMathLab from Pearson education and got NO response or help from them..would rather use the Blackboard as I had with my prior online classes.
- 253. I was not aware it had an on campus final exam, none of my other classes had that. My work schedule does not allow this.
- 254. I was quite happy with the way it was, didn't notice any problems.
- 255. I wish instructors graded online work a little faster.

- 256. I wish instructors would provide their own powerpoint or word document of their ""lecture"" from each chapter. I find it helpful to be taught the material from a different perspective rather than the book and to see the instructor's interpretation/point of view.
- 257. I wish it weren't so expensive to access. You have to pay tuition to take the class, then you have to pay an additional fee to access it from a 3rd party website which is a new concept to me and which I really disliked. However, I understood why it's important for an online class. It makes me mad when teachers who DON'T teach online do this. It makes them seem too lazy to assign their own homework so they have a company do it for them.
- 258. I wish that before a chapter started it explain more about what is going to be learned
- 259. I wish there was a little tutorial on how to work the blackboard site. I mean, I missed out on the first few discussion assignments and it hurt my grade because I didn't know about it. And it wasn't linked into the assignments link--so I thought there was no such assignment.
- 260. I wish there was more time allowed when taking quizes and tests
- 261. I wish we used the discussion panel a little more.
- 262. I would add a little more flexibility again to the time that things are due, especially during the week. Many people take online course because they are working and as such, devote their entire weekends to study. Some professors do not deem this appropriate.
- 263. I would add more core courses online and more 8 week courses
- 264. I would add more minutes to the test time.
- 265. I would add more participation in duscussions from the instructors. I would also change the way that instructors post their material in the Blackboard module requiring that the material they are posting clearly falls under the blackboard tabs. Most of my classes had material like the syllabus posted somewhere other than the syllabus tab.
- 266. I would add one optional meeting at the beguining of the course, to meet the instructor and fellow students.
- 267. I would advise teachers to be more patient and helpful towards student.
- 268. I would appreciate optional (but scheduled) on-campus hours for Q&A/Lecture sessions when assignments are first given, to be mirrored with freely-available online instructional materials (handouts, practice tests, etc.) that present identical (not merely supplementary) information. I would recommend this for ANY type of class, not just online ones. I feel this would enhance the educational experience instead of just altering the medium it's presented in. Also, when instruction to use special/costly computer programs is required to complete the coursework, oncampus meetings should be mandatory, to walk students through their use. Separately, since more effort is generally required to communicate through text, and because the communications are in written form, there is potential for students like myself to find it intimidating, embarrassing, or humiliating to commit the exposure of their own ignorance to a permanent format such as text (whereas I have no problem asking questions in person). Additionally, as opposed to the nature of on-campus meetings, communicating via text can make it time-consuming to properly phrase questions, and difficult to ask the right questions in Additionally I would like to explore the possibility of having a tablet a timely manner. computer to use, so that I could spend time working on projects for online courses (I currently cannot) while I am out and about. I think this would resolve several issues I have related to not having a car, but would make things easier on me even if I had one. There would be a lot less staying up late to finish projects I am too preoccupied to complete during normal waking hours, and it would provide me with additional flexibility in that regard.
- 269. I would ask for more announcements and reminders from teachers. There can never be too many.
- 270. i would change for fully online
- 271. I would change how long we had to turn things in
- 272. I would change nothing about the course
- 273. I would change nothing about the courses I have taken online. I love them. I would like to see more classes offered online as there are some that are still not offered.
- 274. I would change the BB settings for this course. I would want the next course data to become available after I turn in the assignment, rather than waiting for a grade that can be easily

resubmitted and changed. I would also make substitute instructors available for instances where the regular instructor is out of town for more than a week.

- 275. I would change the discussion board, I dont like that I have to grade other peoples work I have enough to do in my day. I have two jobs and I am a single parent the last thing I want to do is grade someone elses work. Isn't there an instructor for that? Maybe not.
- 276. I would change the instructor.
- 277. I would change the level of internet savvy of the instructors, which I'm not sure is possible except through training and more practice with the blackboard platform. I find that many instructors are lacking in basic email and internet skills (using all capitals in announcements and e-mails lacks finesse, and not knowing how to properly upload files or add working links to the course content is a real problem that I have encountered in the past, not to mention strict rules about online testing that, frankly, do not lend themselves to learning. I had an online professor that refused to acknowledge that a glitch in the blackboard system prematurely ended several students' online exams before they even had a chance to answer half the questions. He refused to allow students to retake the exam, and maintained that the error was not his problem and was caused by ignorance/negligence on the part of the student. In this sense, an on-campus course would not present these problems, because the professor would have better control over the administration of face-to-face exams.
- 278. I would change the method of instruction. Instead of reading all text and then taking test after test to prove comprehension, I would like to have different formats such as video to make it more exciting and understandable. The text alone was not enough for me to understand the material so I started looking for explanations on youtube. Once I discovered that most of the subjects were covered in videos on youtube, I stopped reading the text and just watched youtube videos because it was a much faster and efficient way to deliver the material. As far as testing goes, I would change the number of questions required to pass each module. The number of hours I've spent taking tests for my math class is unreasonable for a 3 credit course. I could have taken a 3 credit in-person class on campus and spent 1/3 of the time on both instruction and homework.
- 279. I would change the teacher/student communication

- 285. I would have a option to receive an email sent to the student's personal email account when an email in blackboard is received by the professor or other students. Not everyone knows to check blackboards email and are more likely to check it if they receive the notification in their personal email account.
- 286. I would have found it very helpful to be able to receive notifications on my personal e-mail when new assignments, messages, or announcements were posted on blackboard (just to have the ability to opt into or out of such a setting would be great)
- 287. I would have it be more regulated. Assignments would be posted the same time every week, and graded in a timely manner. Rules and instructions would be clear and easy to understand, and all posted in one central location.
- 288. I would have it more strict. I felt that I never spent enough time on the classes.
- 289. I would have less students in the class so that the professor can get grades/feedback back to us more quickly

- 290. I would have liked a better connection between the book and the online class, perhaps a bit more guided in what to read, what to focus; being emailed chapter summaries, refreshers of chapters and such before the final would be much more helpful.
- 291. I would have liked more personal feedback from the instructor and to have been able to see my grades which he hasn't posted.
- 292. I would have liked the assignments to be available longer than just a few days. Even if assignments overlap I think a week to do them would be better.
- 293. I would have more announcements for example if a test is due at the end of the week, have an announcement almost like a reminder.
- 294. I would have one page with all assignments, quiz test and their due dates somewhere in the placess students acces regularly
- 295. I would have some way of announcing when assignments are open and when they are due. Like sending an email like blackboard.
- 296. I would have somebody to control and check on the amount of material given to students by the teachers, as sometimes teachers take advantage of the lack of feedback from the student by giving large amount of material within a short amount if time
- 297. I would have the instructors make video lectures where you can actually see their faces. It would certainly make online classes feel more legitimate.

Anthropology with Professor \*\*\*. The only thing I feel was handled well by her was resonding to emails. She did respond quickly for the most part which I do appreciate.

- 313. I would like to be able to submit a written assignment. Then revise and make corrections without a penalty on the grade, because there is not any personal contact.
- 314. I would like to be able to take quizzes from the Blackboard App.
- 315. I would like to communicate more with the students online for some supportive help.
- 316. I would like to have due date for all assignments on Sat, and not spread out throughout the week.
- 317. I would like to have the instructor post videos to teach the material himself or at least post some kind of lessons for the material.
- 318. I would like to see an historical photo analysis and or historical painting analysis to the assignment sections of the online course.
- 319. I would like to see and know what all of the assignments for the semester will be very early on in the course because I'd like to input every and all due dates in my calendar so I can plan out my schedules accordingly. I don't like to have to check what new assignments are each week because sometimes I forget to check and there are a lot of work that given week.
- 320. I would like to see discussion boards available for all online courses. I believe the information and experiences of each student benefits everyone. This class offered no component that allowed students to interact with one another.
- 321. I would like to see more interaction with teachers utilizing the books resources such as Web sites or DVD's' issued in the text. I understand that this means more money out of my pocket, but if I am going to take an online class I want all the resources exhausted.

- 1057. The instructor, and blackboard is an awful means for a class. I've still been finding new assignments and links.
- 1058. The instructor, the planning, the old text, the exams. Pretty much everything. I hate to sound negative but please look at the student comments for RE \*\*\* both current and previous. The course, unlike the others I have taken before, was very poor.
- 1059. The instructor.
- 1060. The instructor. Some teachers are not as effective teaching an online class. I have taken several other online courses a few years ago and had very positive experiences because the instructor was organized and responded to email. Those are the two most crucial aspects of online teaching. Blackboard is a great tool if you know how to use it.
- 1061. The instructor. The coursework is easy, read the book, watch the videos, take notes. On more than one occassion i have contacted the instructor due to postings that he announced were up (quizzes and or videos) that i could not gain access to. On 2 occassions he responded too late

for me to complete the assignment and refused to extend the deadline. The first occassion brought my A down to a B and the second threatened to take me down to a C. Luckily the second time enough students complained that he extended the deadline but again since he responded so late i received his email at 10pm on a Sunday, watched the 2 hr video, spent 30 min completing the quiz and when i pressed submit he had removed it as of midnight, 30 min prior... I emailed the answers and he accepted 'this time' as he was extending the due date for other students anyways however i was up until 1245am and had work at 7am. I hardly count this as working around my work schedule...

- 1062. The instructor. To start with his lectures are out dated, his kids constantly interrupt his videos. He does a poor job of explaining concepts or gives a basic explanation of a concept then on a test throws something way out from left field. He's not very helpful when approached. Constantly changing formats. He doesn't use the schools format. - 1066. the instructors who dropped me from the class for not attending the first class should have sent an email out first, even a general one, since one of the classes was partially online and both met mid semester, Not giving out a general reminder BEFORE the first meeting was a huge problem since its hard to keep track of with multiple different start dates.
- 1067. The labs did not work well, were not user friendly, did not correlate with the text book, had hidden fees and was too expensive. The language usage was arcane and switched between common accounting terms and accounting terms that were used in the past. This can be very confusing for people that don't have any experience in accounting terminology. I would be more selective on the online lab that I would select.

- 1072. The major thing I would change about the course is the work load, although I'm sure all that was given would normaly be effective. I felt like there was to much work expected to be done in a week for this one class. I am a student who cares a full load per semester and could not keep up with the work load of this coarse along with the other for class I have. While my CISC online class I had fewer problems keeping up as what was expect to be due every week was much less but still very effective in teach the material.
- 1073. the manitory requirement to response to the students QUESTIONS and CONERNS ABOUT ASSIGNMENTS THAT ARE DUE and WHERE TO ACTUALLY LOCATED THE QUETIONS THAT ARE SUPPOSE TO BE DONE and FINALLY FOR THE PROFESSORS TO HAVE THAT OPEN and ACCESSIBLE TO THE STUDENTS !! ED.
- 1074. The messaging system, which doesn't tell you when you have a message. I found that to be annoying because the professor would respond, but there was no way of knowing you had a message. In the future maybe a message can be sent to the students regular email informing them they have an email in blackboard, I believe that would be more helpful.
- 1075. The one downfall is that you can't ask for help and get an immediate answer, but that is to be excpected. They still have office hours like any teacher and plenty of ways to get in touch with them.

- 1076. The one thing I would change about my course is the lack of communication. The instructor doesn't talk to the students or respond to any emails. The entire class has found it frustrating to have no feedback or assistance from the instructor on questions we have.

- 1081. The only complaint I would have is that sometimes the instructors took way to long to answer, it would be great if the responses were in a 24 hour period. I am not sure if that is possible but it would definitely improve the program. The other suggestion I would make is that for some classes would have assignments posted on the discussion board, some on the syllabus, and some would be in the weekly folders, ideally if all assignments were posted in one place, that way you don't have to constantly check multiple places to make sure you have everything. I am currently working fulltime and beyond this program has made going back to school to finish my degree possible. Thank you to everyone that is a part of this program, over all my entire experience with Mira Mar has been wonderful other then the grouchy women in admissions everyone associated with the school has been amazing.
- 1082. The only extra credit offered was during the week when I was at work. I feel in order to be fair, the extra credit should be offered at varying times to accommodate those with 40+ hr work weeks.
- 1083. The only thing I would change about the course is access to instructors. Sometimes instructors take a long time responding. Other than that I don't think there is much I would change. At least as of now.
- 1084. The only thing that is troublesome about online courses is the teacher's organization and use of blackboard.

- 1092. The professor didn't answer students' questions on the discussion board. Some of the test questions were not addressed in the textbook or the notes, making them nearly impossible to answer correctly.
- 1093. The professor is very hard to reach, and the course materials were lacking. I would prefer to see videos or audio teaching the material, not just notes. It's pretty unclear how you're supposed to learn the concepts if you don't understand the class notes or book.

- 1101. The syllabus and structure of the course have a lot of artifacts from other semesters. It is confusing to have the wrong dates, etc and have to ask numerous times.
- 1102. The teacher because she changed deadline dates and never answered questions previous to the deadline of what i asked
- 1103. The teacher did not give good feedback. She took weeks to grade assignments. She was out of town 2 times during the semester and said she would be unavailble and for us to use our cyber board with classmates
- 1104. the teacher didn't provide any interaction between quizzes and only gave 90 minutes for 80 questions on exams. she was very robotic
- 1105. The teacher is very unorganized and dates have been moved around in the class quite often. Not all material was available to be completed by the due date provided in the syllabus. The teacher takes weeks to return completed assignments.
- 1106. The teacher need to be more active. There are the time i can not find help at all in 2 days. The TA is bad. No respose or answer from her at all

He didn't moderate the discussion board (not that he needed to), but questions such as where the essay prompt was and what the tests were about were left unanswered for over two months, which is unacceptable.
- 1110. The teacher would be more responsive to emails and/or discussion board postings. When participating in an online course, it's difficult to complete assignments when instructors don't respond to emails or have delays of several days before responding via discussion board.
