BP 3250 INSTITUTIONAL PLANNING

The institution's mission directs resource allocation, innovation, and continuous quality improvement through ongoing systematic planning and evaluation of programs and services.

The institution's mission and goals are the foundation for financial planning. Financial information is disseminated to support effective planning and decision-making and provide opportunities for stakeholders to participate in the development of plans and budgets.

The Chancellor shall ensure that the District has and implements a broad-based, comprehensive, systematic, and integrated system of planning and program review that involves appropriate segments of the college community and is supported by institutional effectiveness research.

Areas to be addressed in long-term planning include:

- Long Range Educational and Academic Program Development
- Facilities
- Technology
- Equal Employment Opportunity (EEO)
- Student Equity
- Extended Opportunities Programs and Services (EOPS)

As required, specific institutional plans are kept exclusively at the Colleges and/or the District office.

The Chancellor shall submit those plans for which Board approval is required by Title 5 to the Board.

The Chancellor shall inform the Board about the status of planning and the various plans.

The Chancellor shall ensure the Board has an opportunity to assist in developing the general institutional mission and goals for the comprehensive plans.
