## Background

The data in this report was collected by the San Diego Community College District (SDCCD) in accordance with the Title IX Equal Opportunity in Education Act to determine students' level of interest in intercollegiate athletics and whether the colleges are fulfilling the expressed demand of their students for opportunities to participate in sports. Data was collected from students who completed CCCApply in September, October, and November in an optional survey included in the application.

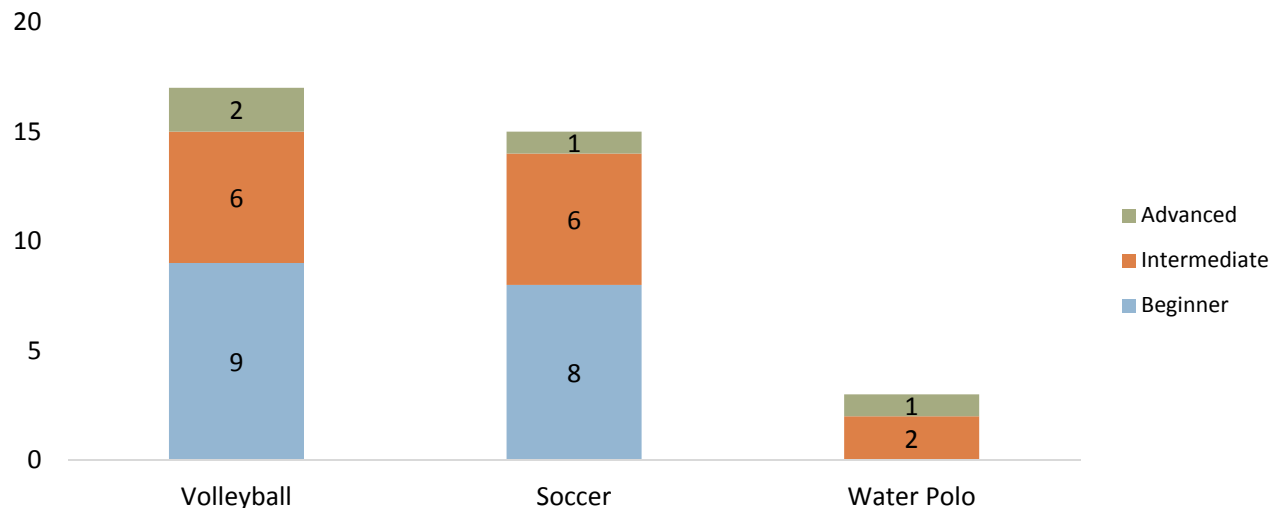
## Respondents' Interest in Intercollegiate Athletics

Of the 246 respondents to the survey in CCCApply, 139 indicated they were interested in competing in intercollegiate sports (56%). 59 of these were female (42% of those interested in competing) and 80 of these were male (58% of those interested in competing).

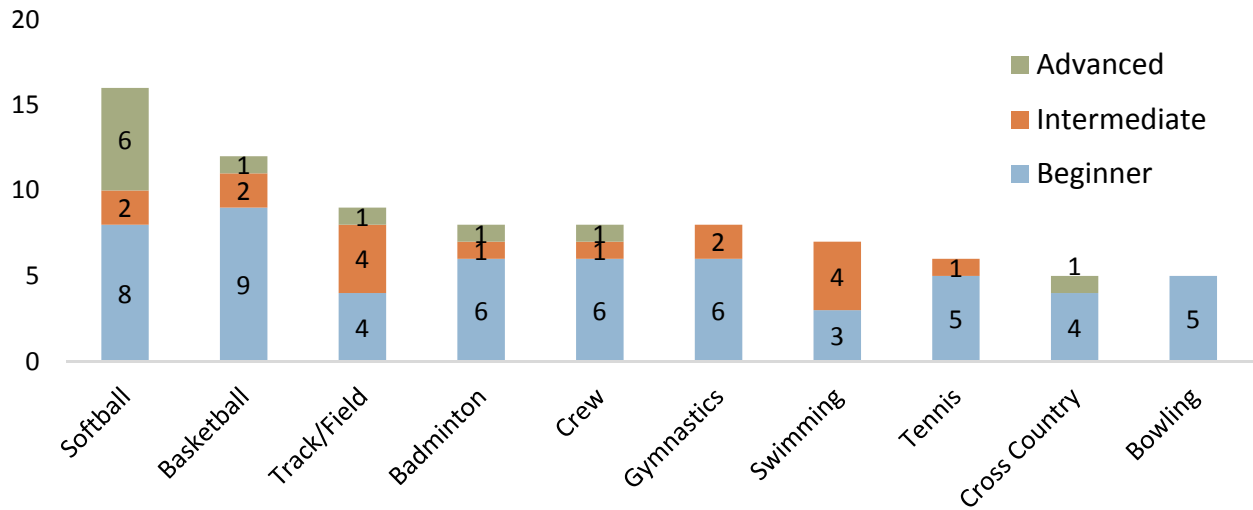
### Female Applicants' Responses

When female applicants indicated that they would be interested in competing in a sport, they most commonly expressed interest in volleyball (n=17). 16 respondents indicated they would be interested in softball (not currently offered at Miramar College), with half of these respondents indicating they were intermediate or advanced at that sport.

**Female Respondents' Expressed Interest in Intercollegiate Sports Offered at Miramar College**



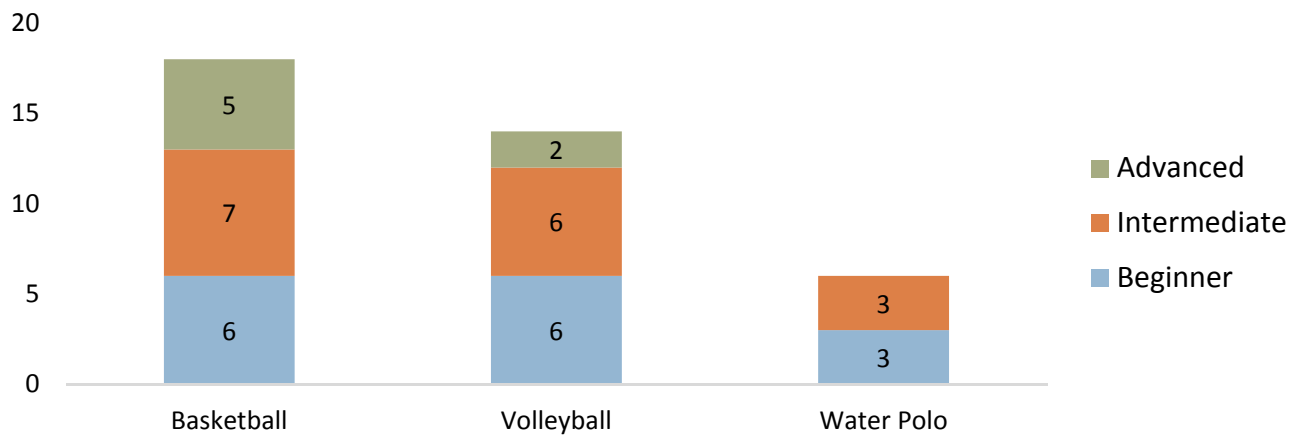
**Female Respondents' Expressed Interest in Intercollegiate Sports

**Male Applicants' Responses**

When male applicants indicated that they would be interested in competing in a sport, they most commonly expressed interest in baseball (n=22), which is not offered at Miramar College. 14 of the respondents who indicated they would be interested in baseball also indicated they were of intermediate or advanced skill level. Male applicants also indicated they would be interested in basketball (n=18), which is offered at Miramar College, and soccer (n=18), which isn't.
