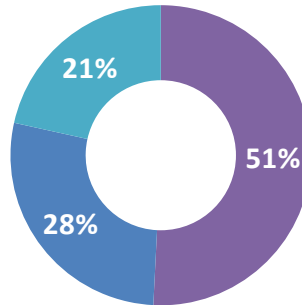
CTE Transitions Credit by Exam

Accelerating Pathways to Completion

The SDCCD CTE Transitions Program coordinates the development, implementation, and management of Career Education credit by exam agreements from local high schools and San Diego Continuing Education to San Diego City, Mesa, and Miramar College. Students meeting the requirements of an agreement are eligible to receive college credit, providing them the opportunity to accelerate their career education goals at City, Mesa, or Miramar College. CTE Transitions credit by exam agreements are faculty led with management and coordination from the SDCCD Career Education and Workforce Development Department (CEWD) and funded in part by the Carl D. Perkins Career and Technical Education Improvement Act. CTE Transitions credit by exam agreements are reviewed every two years to align with CTE program review requirements (title 5).

2018-2019 ACTIVE AGREEMENTS

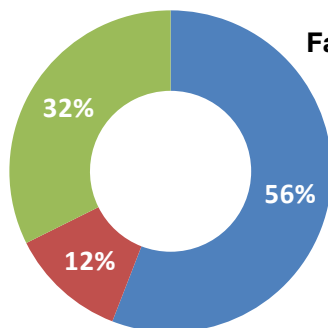
Thirty-two agreements were active: seven active agreements aligning SDCE programming to twenty-three college courses at City, Mesa, and Miramar College and twenty-five agreements aligning high school programming to twenty college courses at San Diego City, Mesa, and Miramar College.

CEWD supported college faculty in the exploration, development, and renewal of thirty-four agreements across ten college career education program areas.

2018-2019 PROGRAM MANAGEMENT UPDATES

- Clarified procedures, updated student petition processes, and enhanced website and online resources.
- Established communication plan and quarterly update on faculty agreement activities.
- For High School to College agreements, revised student petition processing procedures, updated student petition forms for students, parents, and counselors, and developed high school specific one-pagers with active agreement listings for fall 2019 implementation.
- For SDCE to College agreements, reviewed current administrative practices surrounding the agreement development and management processes. A 2019-2020 timeline and action plan for strengthening systems, communication, and outreach is currently in development.

HIGH SCHOOL TO COLLEGE

CEWD works directly with San Diego Unified School District's Office of College and Career Technical Education to coordinate faculty to teacher course alignment discussions and implementation of active agreements.

In 2018-2019 agreement development, renewal, and implementation spanned eight industry sectors and included twenty college courses, across fourteen college career education program areas. Outside of SDUSD, the CTE Transitions Program is embedded within seven additional districts. 2018-19 out-of-district agreement efforts focused on Culinary Arts and Biotechnology.

ADVANCED MANUFACTURING

City College faculty reviewed and renewed one Engineering agreement with twelve SDUSD high schools and developed one new agreement for Machine Technology with one SDUSD high school.

BUSINESS and ENTREPRENEURSHIP

City College faculty explored the development of a new agreement in Cosmetology with one high school from Grossmont Union High School District.

EDUCATION and HUMAN DEVELOPMENT

City, Mesa, and Miramar College faculty reviewed and renewed a multi-college agreement for two Child Development courses with six SDUSD high schools.

City and Mesa College faculty reviewed and renewed a multi-college agreement for two Education courses with three SDUSD high schools.

ENERGY, CONSTRUCTION and UTILITIES

City College faculty reviewed and renewed one Engineering Technology agreement with thirteen SDUSD high schools.

INFORMATION COMMUNICATION TECHNOLOGIES and DIGITAL MEDIA

City College faculty reviewed and renewed one Digital Media and one Digital Photography agreement with ten SDUSD high schools and explored the development of new agreements with SDUSD in Digital Journalism, Computer Science, and Cybersecurity.

Mesa College faculty reviewed and renewed one Computer Business Technology agreement for two courses with two SDUSD high schools and explored the development of new agreements in Computer Science, Digital Media, and Web Development.

Miramar College faculty explored the development of new agreements with SDUSD for Computer Science.

LIFE SCIENCES and BIOTECHNOLOGY

Miramar College faculty renewed agreements in biotechnology with six SDUSD high schools and twelve high schools from seven additional districts.

PUBLIC SAFETY

Miramar College faculty explored the development of a new Administration of Justice Agreement with SDUSD.

RETAIL and HOSPITALITY and TOURISM

Mesa College faculty reviewed and renewed one agreement for Culinary Arts with six SDUSD high schools and three high schools from the Escondido Union High School District.

SAN DIEGO CONTINUING EDUCATION TO COLLEGE

CEWD works with the SDCE Instructional Services Office to support SDCE and City, Mesa, and Miramar faculty in the development and implementation of CTE Transitions credit by exam agreements for pathway alignment between SDCE programming to City, Mesa, and Miramar career education degree and certificate programs.

In 2018-2019 agreement development, renewal, and implementation spanned six industry sectors and included thirty-four college courses across nine college career education program areas.

ADVANCED MANUFACTURING

SDCE and City College faculty developed a new Electronics agreement, aligning SDCE programming to four college courses.

ADVANCED TRANSPORTATION and LOGISTICS

SDCE and Miramar College faculty reviewed and renewed two Automotive agreements, aligning SDCE programs to six college courses.

EDUCATION and HUMAN DEVELOPMENT

SDCE and City, Mesa, and Miramar College faculty reviewed and renewed a Child Development agreement, maintaining alignment with one college course.

ENERGY, CONSTRUCTION and UTILITIES

SDCE and City College faculty developed a new Heating, Ventilation, and Air Conditioning agreement, aligning SDCE programming to two college courses.

INFORMATION COMMUNICATION TECHNOLOGIES and DIGITAL MEDIA

SDCE and City, Mesa, and Miramar College faculty developed a multi-college agreement for Business Information Worker, aligning SDCE programming with seven college courses.

SDCE and City College faculty explored the development of a new Cybersecurity agreement for alignment to three college courses.

SDCE and Mesa College faculty reviewed and renewed one Web Development agreement, maintaining alignment to four college courses, and one Multimedia agreement, maintaining alignment to three college courses.

RETAIL and HOSPITALITY and TOURISM

SDCE and Mesa College faculty reviewed and renewed one Culinary Arts agreement, maintaining alignment with two college courses and began renewal conversations for a Fashion agreement to maintain alignment with two college courses.
