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
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




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Reentry Works & Prison to Employment

- Partnership with San Diego County Sheriff and Probation, Reentry Works and Prison to Employment aims to dramatically increase economic empowerment and decrease recidivism.
- Project created 2 Job Centers at the East Mesa Reentry Facility and Las Colinas Reentry and Detention Facility.
- Emphasis on Earn and Learn services, supportive and wrap around services, and training in demand occupations.
- Project to date has served over 1,300 participants and a 17% recidivism rate compared to the State of California average of 66%.



"I think by helping people already have some kind of structure and direction in place before they get out is tremendous." -Jon David, participant

Expanded Subsidized Employment

- Partnership with County of San Diego County Health and Human Services to provide subsidized employment for recipients of Welfare to Work.
- Project to date, more than 1,100 individuals have been placed in subsidized employment opportunities.
- Project to date, more than 100 businesses have been served.
- Last year a record expenditure rate was set with a total reimbursement to businesses of more than \$1.16 million.
- More than 40% of ESE customers speak a primary language other than English.



Supported Employment

- Partnership with County of San Diego, Corporation for Supportive Housing, & San Diego Workforce Partnership to increase competitive integrated employment opportunities for those living with mental illness or disabilities in our communities.
- Services provided use evidence-based model Individual Placement Support, for employment placement and retention.
- Data indicates a 4% increase in the number of individuals employed through the San Diego Behavioral Health System of Care since onset of program.



"With the confidence and support I received from being able to openly discuss recovery, I became employed as a peer specialist and was later promoted to a case manager." -Supported Employment Participant


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Sector Initiatives


- Lead Workforce Partnership's initiatives to guide talent needs in key priority sectors
