## **Apply to Graduation**

This proposal outlines replacing the phrase "Apply to Graduation" with "Apply for Degree/Certificate" across all student-facing systems and communications. This change was recommended by Academic Advising Workgroup and aligns with terminology already used by local colleges:

## **Apply to Graduation Language (Region X)**

- Palomar: Petition for Graduation: Graduation Evaluations and Records
- Imperial Valley: Application for Graduation (aka Graduation Petition) <u>Graduation</u>
- Cuyamaca College: Apply for Graduation (Graduation Application: Degree/Certificate Application): <u>Graduation Application</u>
- Grossmont: Application for Graduation: <u>How to Graduate with a Degree or Certificate</u>
- Southwestern College: Apply for Degree/Certificate: <u>Apply for Degree/Certificate</u>
- MiraCosta: Graduation Petition: MiraCosta College | Graduate
- UCSD: File for Degree: How to File for Your Degree (Undergraduates)
- SDSU: Application for Undergraduate Application: <u>Application for Undergraduate</u> <u>Graduation | Office of the Registrar | SDSU</u>

## Why this change

- Clarity for students: Many students do not identify with the word "graduation." "Degree/Certificate" explicitly covers both.
- **Reduces confusion**: Distinguishes degree/certificate completion from the separate commencement ceremony process.
- **Consistency**: Matches language used by peer/local colleges, improving transferability of expectations.
- Equity & accessibility: Plainer, inclusive wording benefits new, degree-seeking students.
