(Applicable to San Diego College of Continuing Education (SDCCE) Only)

Benefits

- VA Educational benefits are issued directly to the student for enrollment and attendance into one of San Diego College of Continuing Education's (SDCCE) approved Career Technical Education (CTE) programs. VA educational benefit amount is provided to student with disclaimer of "You may be eligible for up to the monthly rate listed above. Various circumstances may affect your VA educational benefit rates. Please reach out to the VA educational hotline at 1 (888) 442-4551 (7 a.m.-6 p.m. Central Time, Monday-Friday) or visit ASK VA (https://ask.va.gov/) for more information."
- SDCCE is tuition free. No fees are paid directly to SDCCE. No book allowances or vouchers.
- Required or optional Career Technical Education (CTE) course/program material and equipment fees or costs vary by program and are the student's responsibility.
 Certificate programs will provide a syllabus containing a list of any required or optional materials and equipment to students at enrollment. Student materials and/or equipment costs may range between \$100 to \$500. Textbooks and equipment are available for loan by some certificate programs for use during the enrollment term.

Ed-Plans

• Students are only to be certified for approved vocational programs as identified on the student education plan.

Repeating Courses

- Repeating a "D" grade in vocation training is not allowed. "D" is a passing grade for vocational training.
- If the student receives a grade of "F" after completing the total course hours for the course, not based on attendance, the student can repeat the course up to two (2) times. For each repeat, the certifying official extends the end date of the course. The student is placed on probation each time they earn a grade of "F" on their monthly progress report. Once the student passes the course, he/she is deemed to have completed the course and acquired the course competencies. If the student fails the course or earns a grade of "F" on their monthly progress report for a third time, their benefits are interrupted, and a termination form is sent to the VA. A student may be reinstated if he/she maintains satisfactory attendance and progress for one month following termination and interruption in benefits.

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Distance Learning (online) and MHA

 Online, hyflex, or hybrid vocational classes are not permitted. Non-College Degree (NCD) cannot offer these options to Veteran students and are not allowed under VA Education benefits. All classes must be full in-person on campus.

Remedial/Basic Skills

Remedial or basic skill classes are not allowable at SDCCE
